Traverse Independence

Traverse Independence was founded in 1975 as an agency dedicated to developing housing with support services for people with physical disabilities. The organization has evolved from offering supportive housing for 15 clients to serving over 380 clients through eight facilities in the Region of Waterloo and County of Wellington.

We maximize our clients' ability to live independently by providing support services for adults with a physical disability or brain injury.
